Safety Information

WARNING! This shower can deliver scalding temperatures. For continued safe operation, follow all instructions, warnings and cautions contained in this guide and on or inside the shower. Periodic maintenance may be required to keep the product in good working order.

The function of a thermostatic mixing valve is to deliver water consistently at a safe temperature. In keeping with every other mechanism, it cannot be considered as functionally infallible and as such, cannot totally replace a supervisor's vigilance where that is necessary. Provided it is installed, commissioned, operated, and maintained within manufacturers recommendations, the risk of failure, if not eliminated, is reduced to the minimum achievable.

PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING TO REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY:

Installing the Shower

- Installation of the shower must be carried out in accordance with the instructions by qualified, competent personnel. Read all instructions before installing the shower.
- 2. **DO NOT** install the shower where it may be exposed to freezing conditions. Ensure that any pipework that could become frozen is properly insulated.
- **3. DO NOT** perform any unspecified modifications to the shower or its accessories. When servicing only use genuine Kohler Mira replacement parts.
- **4.** If the shower is dismantled during installation or servicing then, upon completion, an inspection must be made to ensure all connections are tight and that there are no leaks.
- **5.** The product may be TMV3 or TMV2 approved. Refer to the installation guide for information regarding product type and installation suitability.

Using the Shower

- **6.** The shower must be operated and maintained in accordance with the requirements of the installation and user guides. Make sure you read all this information fully and understand how to operate the shower before use. Retain all guides for future reference.
- **7. DO NOT** switch the shower on if there is a possibility that the water in the shower unit or fittings is frozen.
- **8.** The water supplies to this product must be isolated if the product is not to be used for a period of time. For example, When away on holiday. If the product or pipework is at risk of freezing during this period, they should also be drained of water.
- **9.** Persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory, or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, can use the shower if they are given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- 10. Anyone who may have difficulty understanding or operating the controls of any shower should be attended whilst showering. Particular consideration should be given to the young, the elderly, the infirm or anyone inexperienced in the correct operation of the controls.
- **11**. **DO NOT** allow children to play with the shower, clean or perform any user maintenance to the shower or it's fittings e.g. Handset and hose.
- **12.** Always check the water temperature is safe before entering the shower.
- **13. DO NOT** adjust the temperature control rapidly while using the shower.
- **14. DO NOT** switch the shower off and back on while standing in the water flow. Use caution when altering the water temperature while in use and always check the temperature before continuing to shower.
- **15. DO NOT** restrict the water flow from the shower outlet, temporarily bending the shower hose or blocking the shower head while in use could cause a hot shot of water to be discharged.

- **16.** When adjusting the handset mode, point handset away from body and make sure the water temperature has stabilised before continuing to shower.
- **17.** The showerheads must be descaled regularly and hose checked for blockage or damage. Blocked showerheads or hose will affect showering performance.
- **18. DO NOT** connect the outlet of the shower to any tap, control valve, trigger operated handset or showerhead other than those specified for use with this shower. Only Kohler Mira recommended accessories should be used.
- **19.** For products with multiple shower outlets, the diverters or on/off controls must be regularly operated to ensure the correct operation of the outlet.
- **20.** This appliance is intended to be permanently connected to the water supplies and not connected by flexible hoses.

Thermostatic Shut-down

 For safety and comfort the thermostat will shut off the mixing valve within 2 Seconds if either supply fails (achieved only if the blend temperature has a minimum differential of 12°C from either supply temperature).

Suitable Plumbing Installations

The Thermostatic Mixer can be installed with all systems with balanced pressures. Mixed gravity and mains supplies are not recommended.


Installation

General

- **1.** Installation of the shower must be carried out in accordance with these instructions by qualified, competent personnel.
- 2. The plumbing installation must comply with all national or local water regulations and all relevant building regulations, or any particular regulation or practice specified by the local water supply company.
- **3.** Make sure all pressures and temperatures comply with the requirements of the shower. See '**Specifications**'.
- **4.** Full bore/non restrictive servicing valves must be fitted in a readily accessible position adjacent to the shower to facilitate maintenance of the shower.
 - **DO NOT** use a valve with a loose washer plate (jumper) as this can lead to a buildup of static pressure.
- **5. DO NOT** apply excessive force to plumbing connections; always provide mechanical support when making plumbing connections. Any soldered joints should be made before connecting the shower.
- **6.** Pipework dead-legs should be kept to a minimum.
- **7. DO NOT** install the shower unit in a position where access for maintenance is restricted.
- 8. The shower must be fitted to a waterproof, flat and even wall surface. The four screws and wall plugs supplied are suitable for most solid wall installations. Alternative fixing screws for panel structures are not supplied. Use all four fixing points to secure the shower, be sure to use fixings appropriate for the chosen wall structure.
- **9.** Pipework enters the product from the rear through a hole in the wall, provision must be made to prevent water ingress back into the wall structure.
- **10.** Position the shower unit where the controls are at a convenient height for the user. Position the showerhead so that the water sprays in line with the bath or across the opening of a shower cubicle. The installation must not cause the shower hose to be kinked during normal use.
- **11.** The water supplies to this product should be isolated if the product is not to be used for a long period of time. If the product or pipework is at risk of freezing during this period they should also be drained of water.

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12. The position of the shower and shower fittings must provide a minimum air gap of 25 mm between the showerhead and the spill over level of any bath, shower tray or basin. There must be a minimum distance of 30 mm between the showerhead and the spill over lever of any toilet, bidet or other appliance with a Fluid Category 5 backflow risk.



Note: For safety, in case minimum air gaps are not achieved this product is fitted with double check valves.

In low pressure installation this will reduce flow.

The check valve in the handset can be removed to achieve improved flow. However, if removed an alternative hose retaining ring is required. These are available through Mira Customer Services.


For Fluid Category 5, double checkvalves are not suitable.



Note: Recommended installation height for the valve is 1050 mm, 720 mm for shower fittings and 1050 mm for soap dish from shower tray surface in new installations. Installer can choose a preferred location.




Determine the route for the supply pipes.

Note: This product is suitable for rear supplies only.



Use the template provided to mark the positions of the pipes and fixing holes.

Note: There are four positions to screw the mixing valve to the wall, all four MUST be used.



Fit the supply pipework.

Inlet pipes must extend 20 mm from the finished wall surface, and be square to the wall. Continue from step 3 on page 17.




Replacement Installation

The adjustable elbows each have adjustment, allowing your thermostatic mixer to be connected to pipe centres ranging from 110 mm to 155 mm.




Carefully remove the existing product and place on a flat surface. Refer to the installation guide supplied with the existing product for any help.



Inlet pipes must extend 10-27 mm from the finished wall surface, and be square to the wall. If pipes are longer than 27 mm cut and deburr pipe to a suitable length.

Measure the distance between the two inlet pipes (Distance A).

If the distance between the two inlet pipes centres is not 153 mm, remove the retaining clips as shown and recycle them.




Measure the distance between the inlet face and the flat surface (**Distance B**) for the previously installed product.

Refer to the table below to find the correct configuration for the inlet connections.

Note: Identification on the mixing valve shows the orientation that the valve must be fixed to the wall. Ensure the "TOP" marking faces to top of the product.

Remove the inlet sleeves using 6 mm hex key. Note the "A" and "B" markings on the inlet sleeves. Swap the sleeves and fit onto the mixing valve oriented as shown.





Ø 6mm drill required for wall plugs supplied






Drill the four fixing holes for the backplate.

DO NOT drill through the backplate into the wall.

DO NOT drill into buried cables or pipes.



Flush the water supplies thoroughly before connecting the mixing valve.

Note: Identification on the mixing valve shows the orientation that the valve must be fixed to the wall. Ensure the "TOP" marking faces to top of the product.

Place the concealing plates, compression nuts and olives **(new installation only)** over the pipes.

Place the mixing valve over the inlet pipes. Finger tighten both the compression nuts and then fix the mixing valve to the wall using the wall screws (x4) and wall plugs provided. Alternartive wall fixings can be used. Stainless steel screws are recommended. Retighten the compression nuts using a suitable spanner while supporting the elbow with a 6 mm hex key as shown.

Check for leaks.


Note: There are four positions to screw the mixing valve to the wall, all four MUST be used.




Reversed Inlet Supplies


If the *HOT* water supply is on the *RIGHT HAND* side, the shower's control cartridge must be reversed. The following steps show how to swap the hot and cold water inlet positions of the cartridge.

Isolate the water supplies and turn the shower on/off to relieve the water pressure.



Loosen the four valve screws and remove the mixing valve from the valve body.





Slide the shroud over the valve and push until clipped. Ensure that outlets are in the correct position and drive features match. Rotate the temperature handle slightly to align if there is any resistance. The shroud should click and clip into place.

Pull the shroud gently to ensure it is properly clipped into place.


The shower is factory pre-set to a safe maximum temperature, restricting the dial to setting 7. Higher temperatures can be achieved by changing this pre-set. Refer to **Commissioning Section** on page 30.

Continue directly to page 24 if installing the Flex Shower Fittings.



Single Outlet Shower Fitting






Mark the wall fixing positions and drill two holes to suit the wall fixings.

Caution! Do not drill into cables or pipes in the wall. Note: Installation fixing centres are 630 mm for the 660 mm slidebar.

Install the wall plugs and the mounting brackets and secure with the wall screws. Alternative wall fixings can be used. Stainless steel screws are recommended.

Note: Verify that the locking pegs are orientated correctly.

Note: Check for vertical alignment before tightening. The mounting brackets are slotted to aid this alignment. Then fully tighten.



Hole

Install the clamp bracket, the hose retaining ring (smallest hole) and the slidebar supports to the slidebar.

Note: Orientate the hole on the slidebar supports in line with the locking peg on mounting bracket.


Ensure an equal length of slidebar protrudes from the top and bottom slidebar support (or flush with the end of the slidebar for new installations) and push onto mounting brackets. Ensure it clicks into place.

Caution! DO NOT force assembly onto the mounting brackets. Re-align slidebar support if required.

Important! Ensure that the locking pegs click in and are fully engaged in the holes in the slidebar support.

Install the endcaps, push fit into both ends of the slidebar.

Note: If slidebar support requires removal. Using a suitable tool, push and hold down the locking peg through the hole in the slidebar support and pull it off.



Information for Flow Regulators:

Mira Select is pre-fitted with a 11 L/min flow regulator in the valve outlet to reduce water usage.

For maintained pressures below 1 Bar, we recommend removing the flow regulator for improved performance.

In high pressure installations, flow control may be limited, if you require lower flow, contact Mira Customer Services for an alternative 8 L/min flow regulator.

Hose and Handshower Installation

Fit a hose seal into the end of the hose and screw onto the outlet of the valve.

Caution! DO NOT over tighten.


Feed the hose through the hose retaining ring.

Fit a hose seal into the end of the hose and screw onto the handshower.

Place the handshower into the clamp bracket assembly.

Only use the supplied handset with this product.


Clamp Bracket Operation




Press the two buttons on the clamp bracket to adjust the position.

Warning! Slidebar must not be used as a grab rail.

Continue directly to the **Commissioning Section** on page 30.






- 1. Carefully remove paper wrap from the slide rail.
- **2.** Ensure both assembly tools are fully pushed down.
- 3. Push the clamp bracket onto the slide rail until it reaches a stop.
- **4.** Place assembly upright in the vertical position (place a protective cover on the floor).
- **5.** Tap on the top of the assembly with your hand until the first assembly tool ejects.
- **6.** Slide the rail onto the clamp bracket to the next stop position.
- **7.** Tap on the top of the assembly with your hand until the second assembly tool ejects.

Note: Recycle assembly tools.

Note: The clamp bracket assembly tools will eject as the clamp bracket fits onto the rail.






Push the end brackets into the both ends of the slide rail and make sure that end brackets are pushed firmly.

Tighten the two screws to secure the end brackets onto the slide rail.

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Hold the slide rail assembly against the wall in the desired position.

Mark the positions of the top and bottom fixing holes using the slide rail brackets as a template.

Note: Use a spirit level to ensure the bar is vertical.

Note: Mark one of the vertical oval holes and one of the horizontal oval holes to allow slight adjustments to the slide rail.

Drill two 8 mm fixing holes and install the wall plugs. Alternative wall fixings can be used. Stainless steel screws are recommended.


DO NOT drill through the slide rail brackets into the wall.


Caution! Do not drill into cables or pipes in the wall.

Note: Installation fixing centres are 1134 mm for the slidebar.

Fit the slide rail to the wall and tighten the screws, ensuring the rail is vertical.

Fit the end caps over the end brackets.





Fit the shower hose onto the bottom outlet of the mixing valve.

The hose has a swivel end for easy handset alignment. Green end fits to the handset and red end fits to the valve.

Information for Flow Regulators:

- Mira Select is pre-fitted with a 11 L/min flow regulator in the valve outlet to reduce water usage.
- For maintained pressures below 1 Bar, we recommend removing the flow regulator for improved performance.
- For Gravity Fed systems, remove the flow regulator from the valve and the check valve from the flex handset.

Push the shower hose through the retaining ring and screw it to the handshower. Make sure that the hose washer is fitted.

Place the handshower into the clamp bracket, adjusting the angle and height to the user's preference.


Note: In low pressure installation the check valve in the handset will reduce flow. It can be removed to achieve improved flow. However, if removed an alternative hose retaining ring is required. These are available through Mira Customer Services.



Decide on a suitable position for the soap dish avoiding any buried cables and pipes.

Place the soap dish frame on the wall and mark the position of the fixing holes. Recommended height 1050 mm from the shower tray (see page 11).


Note: Use a spirit level to ensure the soap dish frame is horizontal.




Drill the two fixing holes for the soap dish frame.

DO NOT drill through the soap dish frame into the wall.

DO NOT drill into buried cables or pipes.



Install the soap dish frame to the wall using the supplied wall plugs and screws. Alternative wall fixings can be used. Stainless steel screws are recommended.




Remove the protective film from the soap dish frame.

Place the soap dish inside the frame with the drain slot at the front.



Operation of Flex Shower Fitting



Slide the clamp bracket assembly up and down along with the slide rail until the handshower is positioned to your preference.

Rotate the clamp bracket and handshower as shown to suit your preference.

Changing shower head spray pattern:

The spray pattern can be changed by pressing the black button on the front of the shower head. Each button press will cycle to the next of the three different spray patterns: full coverage, forceful jet, and narrow coverage spray.


Commissioning

Maximum Temperature Setting


Before using the shower, the maximum temperature must be checked to make sure that it is at a safe level. It has been preset to a safe showering temperature under ideal conditions at the factory, appropriate for most systems. However, site conditions and personal preference may make it necessary to reset this temperature.

Note: Make sure that the hot water temperature is at least 55°C and that there is sufficient supply.

Caution! Before making any adjustments to the shower, operate the temperature control from maximum hot to cold and make sure hot and cold water flows correctly from the shower outlet. After making any adjustments repeat this process.




- 1. Turn on the water supply and open water inlet supply isolators to maximum.
- 2. Press the ON/OFF button to turn ON the shower.
- 3. Turn the temperature handle **anticlockwise** until it stops and test that the temperature of the water from the shower outlet is hot enough. If not, complete the following procedure.
- **4.** Turn the temperature lever to "5" and turn OFF the shower.
- **5.** Locate a flat blade screwdriver into the slot under the cap and twist gently avoiding damage.
- **6.** Remove the cap.
- 7. Remove the screw using a 3 mm hex key and remove the temperature handle.



- **8.** Remove the temperature stop ring and rotate by the required number of splines within the marked temperature range.
- 9. Refit the temperature stop ring and turn anticlockwise against the stop.


Note: Maximum temperature achievable is 49°C.



- **10.** Turn ON the shower and check the showering temperature.
- **11.** Turn OFF the shower. Align the "5" on the handle with "top" marked on the control hub and refit the handle screw and cap.

Operation

Important! Read the 'Safety Information' before using your shower.



Increase Temperature

On/Off and Temperature Control

Press the ON/OFF button to turn the product ON or OFF.

Adjusting the Temperature

The temperature increases by rotating the temperature handle in anticlockwise direction. Rotate the handle clockwise to reduce the temperature.

Adjusting the Flow


The flow is controlled by rotating the flow handle. The flow increases by rotating the flow handle in the clockwise direction. Rotate the handle anticlockwise to reduce the flow.

User Maintenance

WARNING! PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING TO REDUCE THE RISK OF INJURY OR PRODUCT DAMAGE:

- **DO NOT** allow children to clean or perform any user maintenance to the shower unit without supervision.
- If the shower is not to be used for a long period, the water supply to the shower unit should be isolated. If the shower unit or pipework is at risk of freezing during this period, a qualified, competent person should drain them of water.


Inlet Filter Cleaning



Isolate the water supplies and turn the shower on to relieve the water pressure.


Turn OFF the shower.

Disconnect the hose from the shower unit. Retain all parts carefully for reinstallation.




Locate a large flat blade screwdriver behind the bottom-side edge of the shroud, gently twist the screwdriver to lever off the shroud while supporting the front.

Pull off the shroud from valve assembly.



Remove the inlet filters using 6 mm hex key. Rinse the filters in clean water, removing any dirt or debris. Wipe the inside of the elbow with a clean cloth to remove any remaining debris. Replace if the filter mesh is damaged.



Note: Ensure that the spline is oriented in line as shown above.

Slide the shroud over the valve and push until clipped. Ensure outlets are in the correct position and drive features match. Rotate the temperature handle slightly to align if there is any resistance. The shroud should click and clip into place.

Pull the shroud gently to ensure it is properly clipped into place.

Install shower fittings.

Restore the water supplies and check for leaks.

Cleaning

Always read the IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION for your shower.

Cleaning the showerhead


Many household and commercial cleaners, including hand and surface cleaning wipes contain abrasive and chemical substances that can damage plastics, plating and printing and should not be used. These finishes should be cleaned with a mild washing up detergent or soap solution, and then wiped dry using a soft cloth.

De-scaling the Showerhead and inspecting the hose

It is IMPORTANT to keep the Showerhead and Hose clean and free from blockage to make sure your shower performs to its optimum. The showerhead MUST be regularly cleaned and the hose MUST be regularly inspected to ensure there is no internal collapse or blockage that could reduce the flow.



Use your thumb or a soft cloth to wipe any limescale from the soft nozzles.




Unscrew the hose from the handshower and the shower outlet.



Inspect the hose.

Warning! Failure to keep the showerhead nozzles clear or inspect the hose for blockage or internal/external collapse can restrict the flow rate from the shower. This may cause damage to the shower or result in the temperature delivered to the user rising to unsafe levels with a risk of scalding. You MUST ALWAYS check the temperature before using the shower.

Spray Plate Removal



- **1.** Insert the prongs (x2) of the spray plate removal tool supplied into the corresponding holes in the spray plate.
- **2.** Turn the removal tool anticlockwise and unscrew the spray plate from the showerhead body.
- **3.** Clean all the components with a stiff brush. If necessary use a plastic kettle descalent in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- **4.** Flush thoroughly with water before the shower is used.
- **5.** Refit the components in reverse order. Take care not to cross thread the spray plate.
